COORDINATION + COMMUNICATION

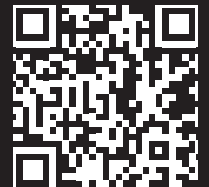
The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) believes in the lifesaving power of interagency partnerships and responder collaboration so much that it has entire centers and offices dedicated to the effort. This includes the Office of Disaster Emergency Communications, the National and Regional Coordination Centers, and the Emergency Operation Center.¹ It's a key tenet of their National Response Framework (NRF).²

Locally, these tenets of coordination and communication are outlined and supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).³
